1. Madame DeRosa

Our Spin:

Many years ago when Melissa DeRosa was in her mid-twenties and working in the private sector, Feathers had dinner with her “office team,” and some mutual clients. During dinner, one of the clients asked, “how Albany worked?” Before anyone else spoke, Melissa turned over her napkin and began writing names and drawling lines showing connections. According to Feathers, when she was done she had solved the rubrics cube on Albany politics. Hardly a thug, she is more likely to be the Bobby Fischer of Secretaries. Congratulations Melissa... By the way, to our old friend Ed Cox who levelled the “thug,” charge, go ahead and have a Bloody Mary now and then Ed, it will calm you down!

The Story:

As part of a major transition in Governor Andrew M. Cuomo’s second-term administration, Melissa DeRosa, his chief of staff, was appointed on Monday as Secretary to the Governor. DeRosa will not only be the first woman to serve as secretary to the governor, but at 34 years old, will also be the youngest. She started with Cuomo in April 2013 as his communications director after serving as deputy and then acting chief of staff to Attorney General Eric Schneiderman. She is taking over for William Mulrow, who is going back to his old Wall Street firm, The Blackstone Group. Despite DeRosa just being named as one of Crain’s New York 40 under 40

rising stars, Cuomo has faced criticism since the hiring as DeRosa is the daughter of Giorgio DeRosa, a prominent Albany lobbyist and partner at Bolton St. Johns, a top lobbying firm. Her husband is Matt Wing, a former Cuomo administration spokesman who now works at the ride hailing company Uber. On Wednesday Cuomo defended the appointment, even suggesting questions over her family’s business ties might be sexist.

“Melissa DeRosa is the first female Secretary to the Governor,” Cuomo said. “She’s worked for me, she’s worked for the Attorney General. She’s one of the young superstars in the business. Her father is a longtime, well-known lobbyist in Albany. Everybody knows that. So, I don’t see the issue whatsoever.” Cuomo then went further, questioning reporters whether they would ask about the conflicts of interest for a man who is related to a lobbyist, either through marriage or by parentage. “You know there’s some men whose wives are lobbyists,” he said. “But I’m sure you are going to ask every man whose wife is a lobbyist or mother is a lobbyist.”

2. Cuomo Construction Inc.

Our Spin:

As Governor, Andrew Cuomo has proven to be a leader who wears many hats, sometimes even a hard hat. In no uncertain terms the Governor has proclaimed that

rebuilding New York’s infrastructure is a top priority. As he maneuvers through his second term it has become apparent that the Governor is building his legacy, literally. The Legislature is heading back to Albany next week, but based on the Governor’s recent remarks we think we will be hearing more about Robert Moses and less about ethics reform.

The Story:

Speaking with reporters over the weekend, Governor Cuomo said he’s just about done dealing with the Legislature for the remainder of the year now that the state budget has been approved. Instead, he will focus his efforts in the remaining months of the legislative session to building things. “My top priority now is getting the economy running upstate and rebuilding infrastructure all across the state... We have the financial commitment, but now these things have to happen,” Cuomo said. “You have to stay after these things. It’s like you’re doing a construction project in your home: If you don’t stay on the contractor every day, they’re going to be late, and if you don’t question every change order it’s going to be over budget. So that’s what I’m going to do.” As a result, the possibility that he and the Legislature agree to deals before the legislative session ends in June on an ethics reform package or to create a state DREAM Act seem very slim. “Those that weren’t done in the budget, I don’t know that they’re feasible to get done. If we didn’t get it done in the budget, it means you don’t have the political will to get done,” Cuomo said. Lawmakers return at the end of this month to a thin legislative agenda in Albany. The renewal of mayoral control of New York City schools at the end of June is the only truly deadline-driven concern, while lawmakers may also make a push for a bill that ends child marriage in the state.
